•	Discipline the Those who continue in sin, rebuke in the presence of all, so that the rest also will be fearful <i>of sinning</i> 1 Timothy 5:20
3. Choose Them	
•	With Do not lay hands upon anyone <i>too</i> hastily and thereby share <i>responsibility for</i> the sins of others; keep yourself free from sin 1 Timothy 5:22 The sins of some men are quite evident, going before them to judgment; for others, their <i>sins</i> follow after. ²⁵ Likewise also, deeds that are good are quite evident, and those which are otherwise cannot be concealed 1 Timothy 5:24-25
•	With No longer drink water <i>exclusively</i> , but use a little wine for the sake of your stomach and your frequent ailments 1 Timothy 5:23
