	Cast your bread on the surface of the waters, for you will find it after many days. Divide your portion to seven, or even to eight, for you do not know what misfortune may occur on the earth. Ecclesiastes 11:1-2
	There is one who scatters, and <i>yet</i> increases all the more, And there is one who withholds what is justly due, <i>and yet it results</i> only in want. <sup>25</sup> The generous man will be prosperous, And he who waters will himself be watered - Proverbs 11:24-25

	• There are things you can't He who watches the wind will not sow and he who looks at the clouds will not reap. <sup>5</sup> Just as you do not know the path of the wind and how bones are formed in the womb of the pregnant woman, so you do not know the activity of God who makes all things Ecclesiastes 11:4-5
	• Step out and Sow your seed in the morning and do not be idle in the evening, for you do not know whether morning or evening sowing will succeed, or whether both of them alike will be good Ecclesiastes 11:6
3	The light is pleasant, and <i>it is</i> good for the eyes to see the sun. <sup>8</sup> Indeed, if a man should live many years, let him rejoice in them all, and let him remember the days of darkness, for they will be many. Everything that is to come <i>will be</i> futility. <sup>9</sup> Rejoice, young man, during your childhood, and let your heart be pleasant during the days of young manhood. And follow the impulses of your heart and the desires of your eyes. Yet know that God will bring you to judgment for all these things. <sup>10</sup> So, remove grief and anger from your heart

and put away pain from your body, because childhood and the prime of life are fleeting. Ecclesiastes 11.7-10
