Getting Started with a Warm-Up:

- The Bible tells us that God is *omniscient* (all-knowing) and *omni-present* (everywhere). Which one of these is the most difficult for you to comprehend? Why?
- Does the idea of God's providence comfort you or concern you?
- We can look back on the story of Moses' birth (Read Exodus 1:1-2:10) and see God's obvious work behind the scenes. Where do you see the obvious evidence of God's working behind the scenes to this point in your life?

Getting Down to Business:

The following questions are following this format: Scripture, Observation, Application, and Prayer (SOAP).

- 1) **Scripture/Observation:** Read Psalm 139:1-16 (Below is an excerpt from the Bible Panorama commentary that you can access by following the link after the excerpt.)
- A. In verses 1-6 what specific things does the psalmist say that God knows about him? (v1. My heart and everything; v2. My actions and thoughts; v3. When I travel or rest; v4. My words before hand)
- B. From verse 6 explain the psalmist's response to what God knows about him.
- C. After reading verses 7-12, why do you suppose we try to hide our thoughts and ourselves from God? What famous couple in scripture tried to hide from God's presence? (Hint: naked, fruit)
- D. How would explain verse 11 and 12? This verse from scripture might help you "This is the message we heard from Jesus and now declare to you: God is light, and there is no darkness in him at all." (1 John 1:5, NLT)

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E. How do verses 13-16 help you in your understanding of God's providence as it relates to you?

The Bible Panorama Commentary

V 1–6: OMNISCIENT - God not only knows everything about everything, but He knows everything about David. God is never surprised, but David is lost in amazement.

V 7–10: OMNIPRESENT - Wherever David goes and in whatever situation he finds himself, he finds that God is there.

V 11–12: OBSERVING - Day time and night time are the same to God. He observes David's actions at all times.

V 13–16: OBVIOUS - All the evidence of the wonder of God's creative and designing miracle of human conception and gestation is obvious. God's involvement in the life of a child does not begin at birth, but at conception.
